UNICEF's work is based on the UN's Convention on the Rights of the Child. The funds raised by UNICEF Walks allow UNICEF and its partners to provide school supplies and to organise alternative learning approaches so that children in Myanmar can continue their education in all circumstances.

UNICEF Walk in a nutshell

Before the event, schools learn about the purpose of UNICEF walks and pupils find sponsors from among their family, who donate an amount of their choice for every kilometre the pupil completes. Pupils may also participate in the event without a sponsor.

For every kilometre completed at the event, pupils will receive a sticker in their UNICEF Walk passport.

After the event, sponsors donate a sum determined by the total number of stickers, either as cash in a sponsor envelope or by making an online donation at unicef.fi/unicef-kavely.
